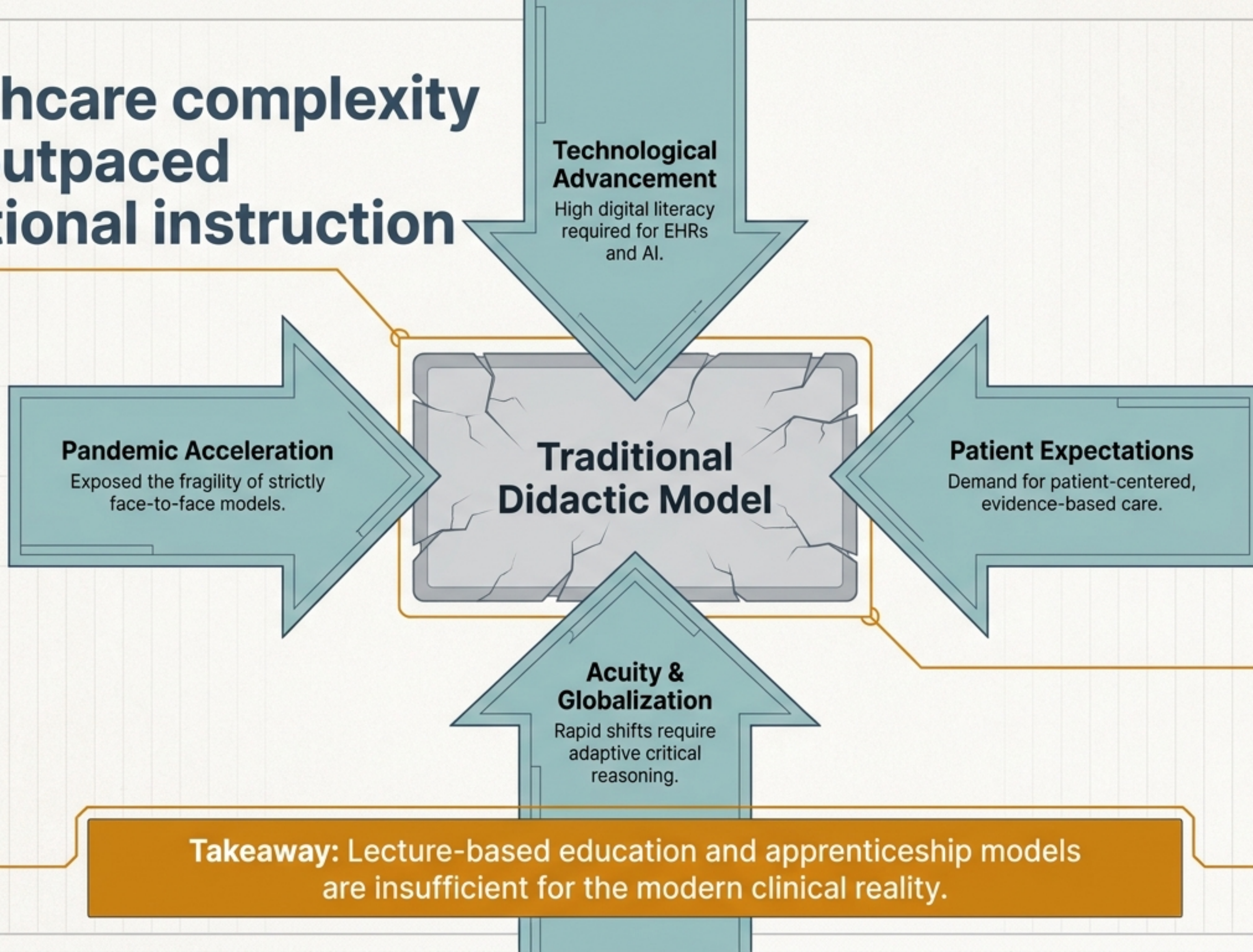

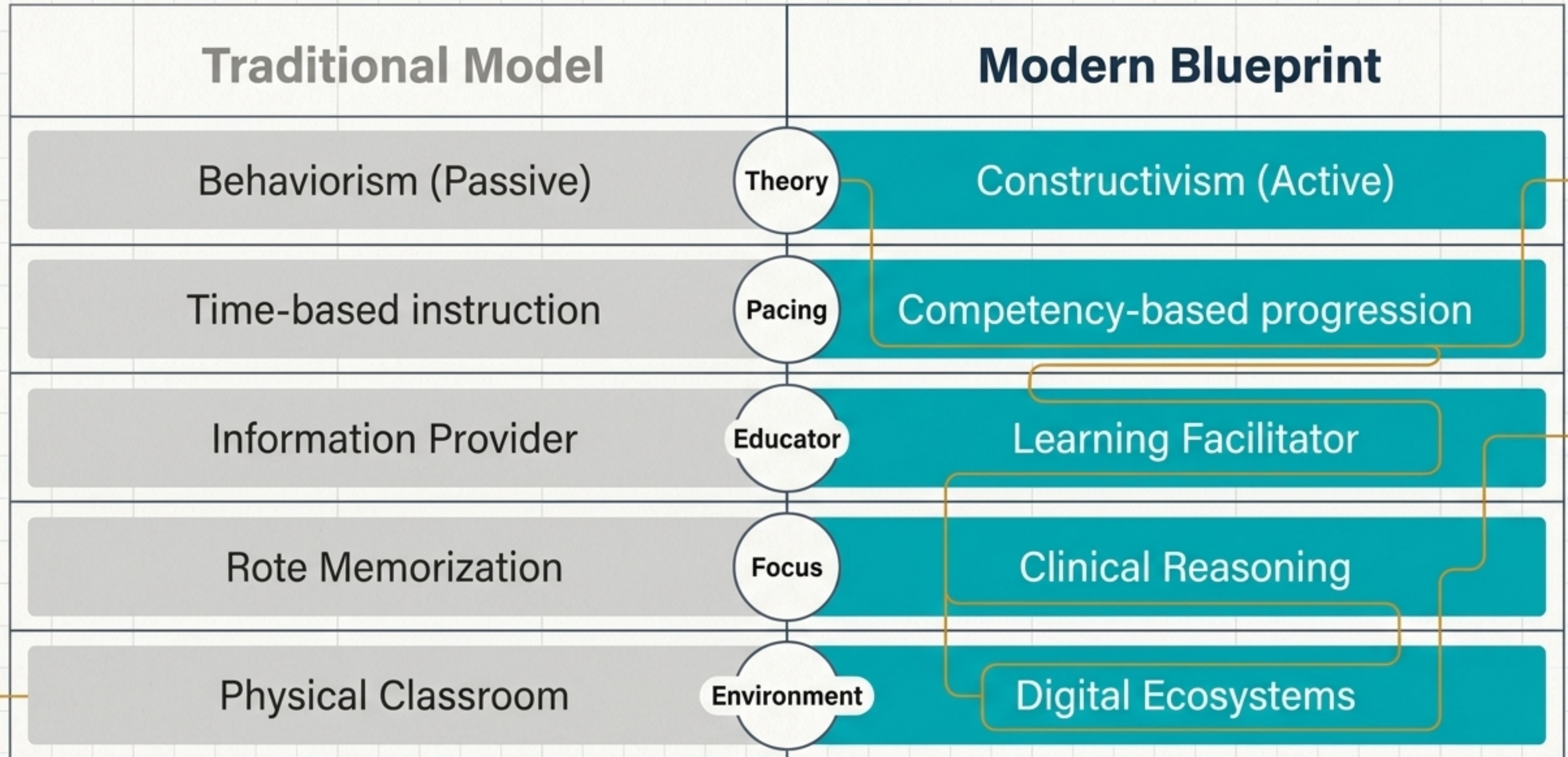

Healthcare complexity has outpaced traditional instruction



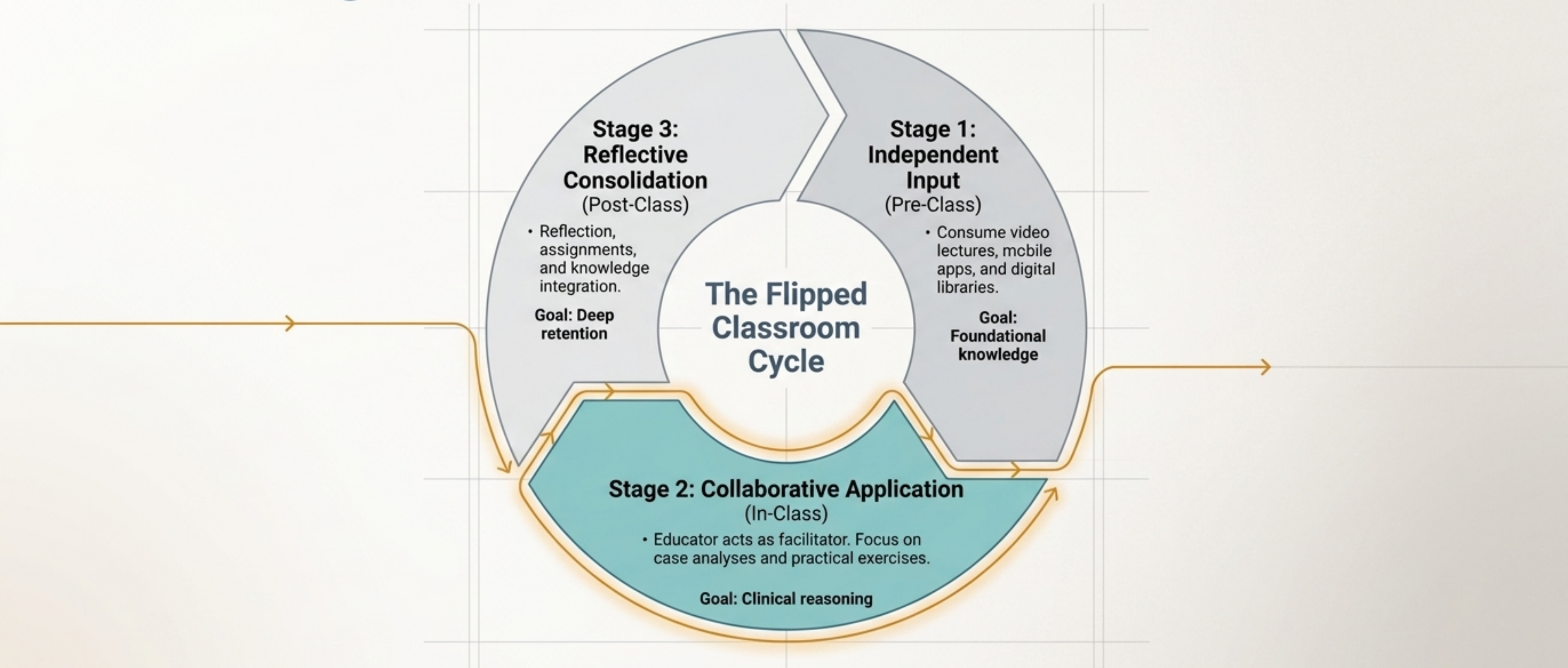

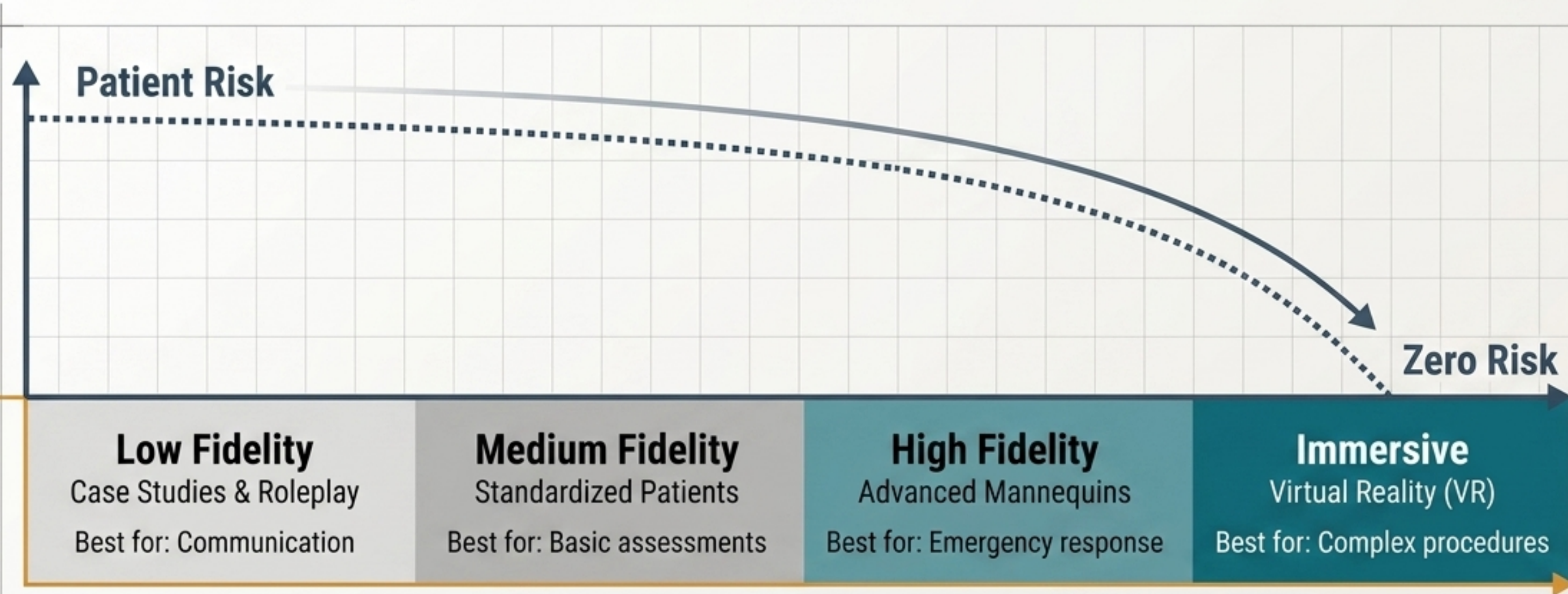

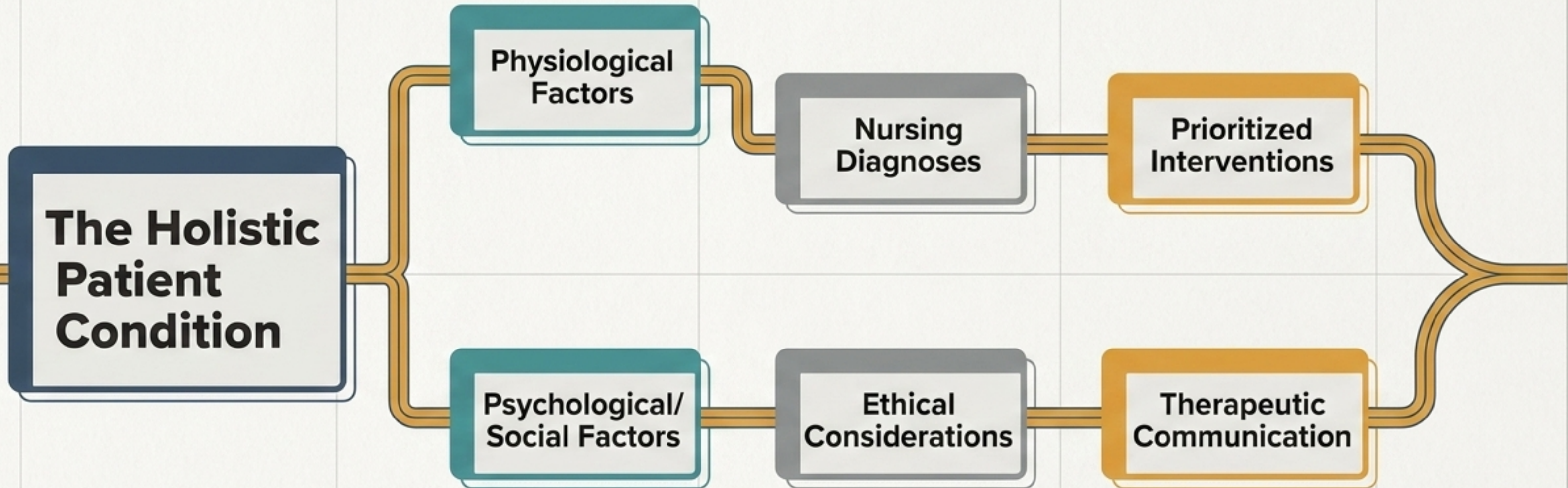

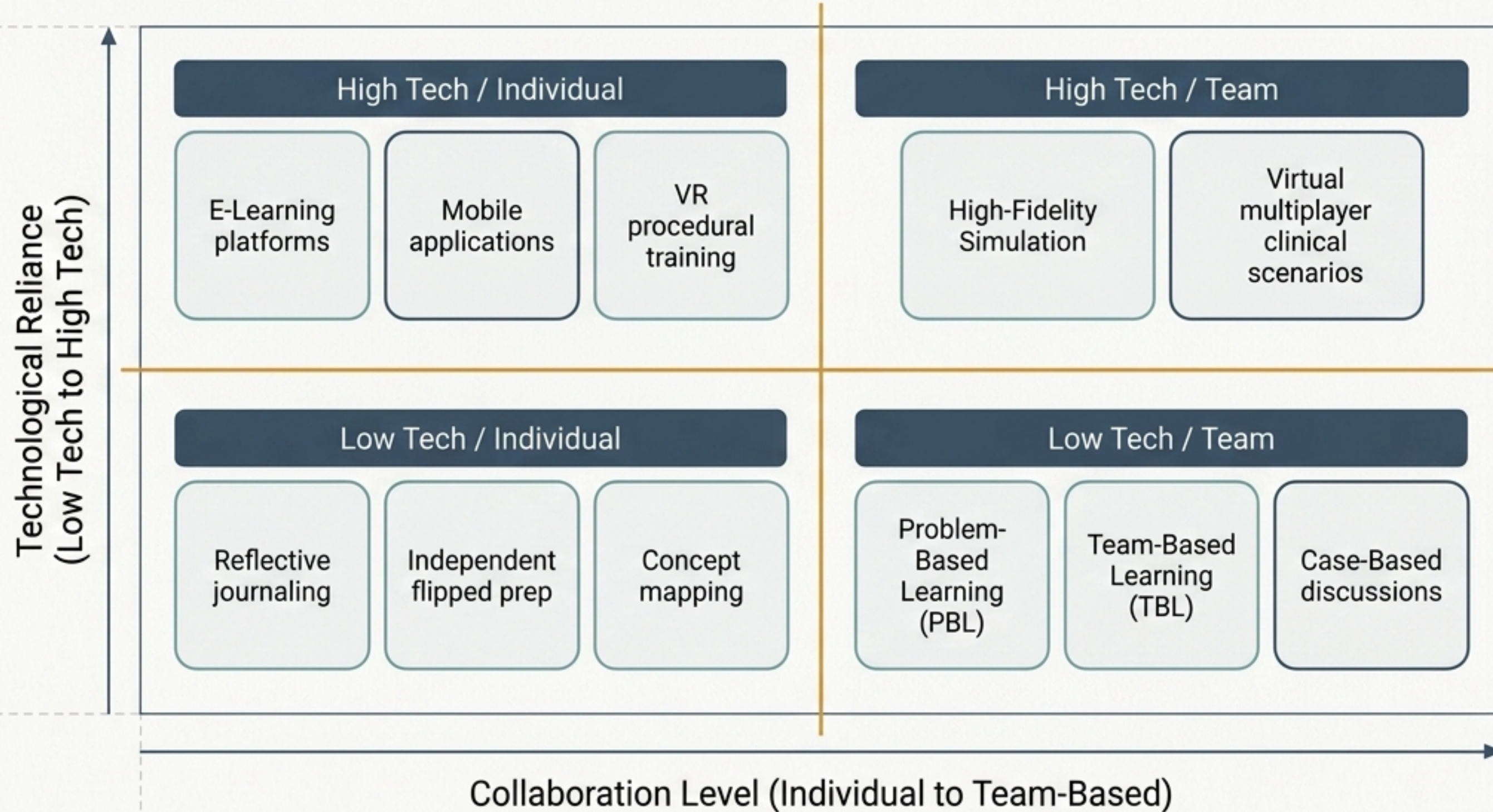
The Simulation Fidelity Spectrum

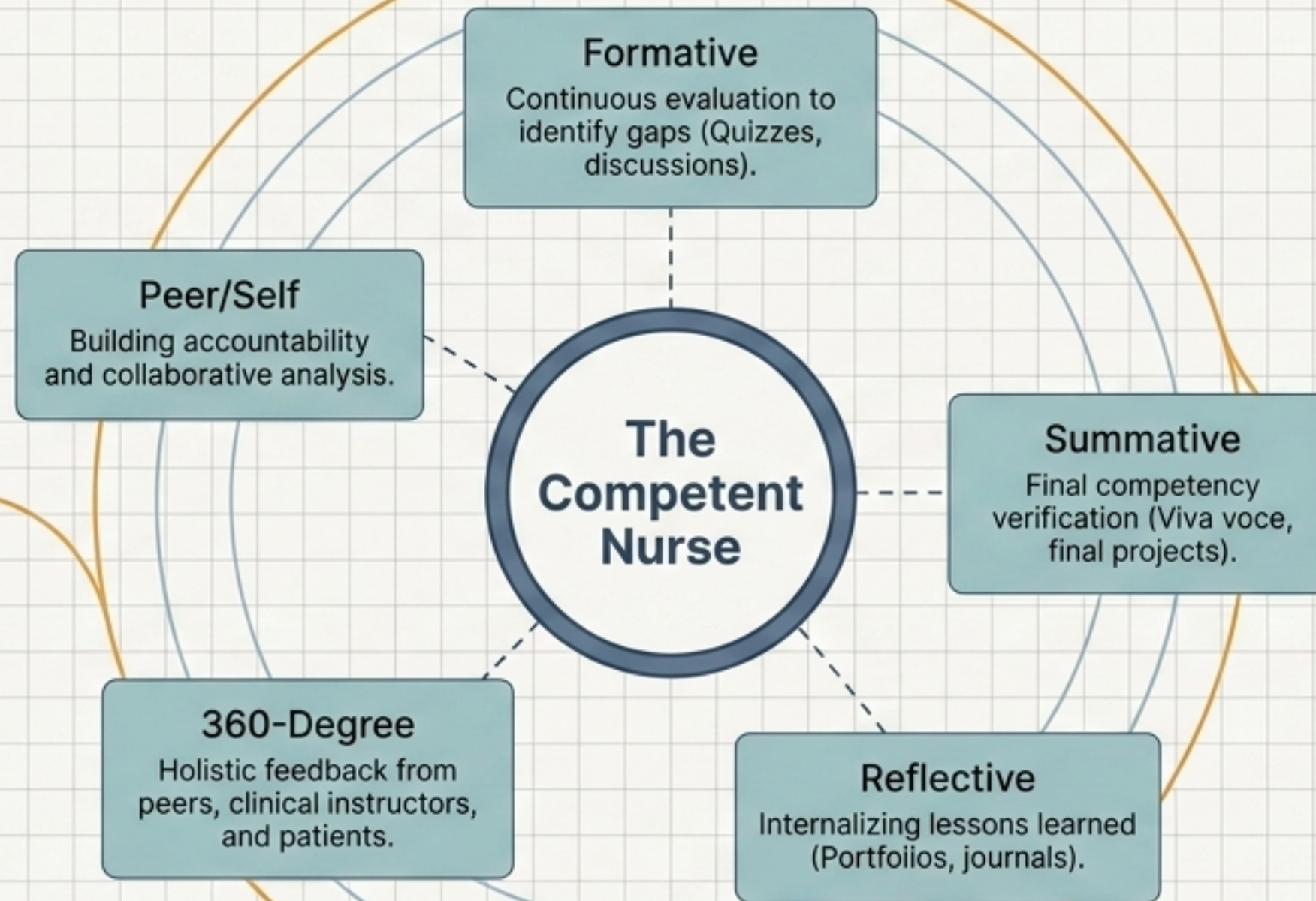

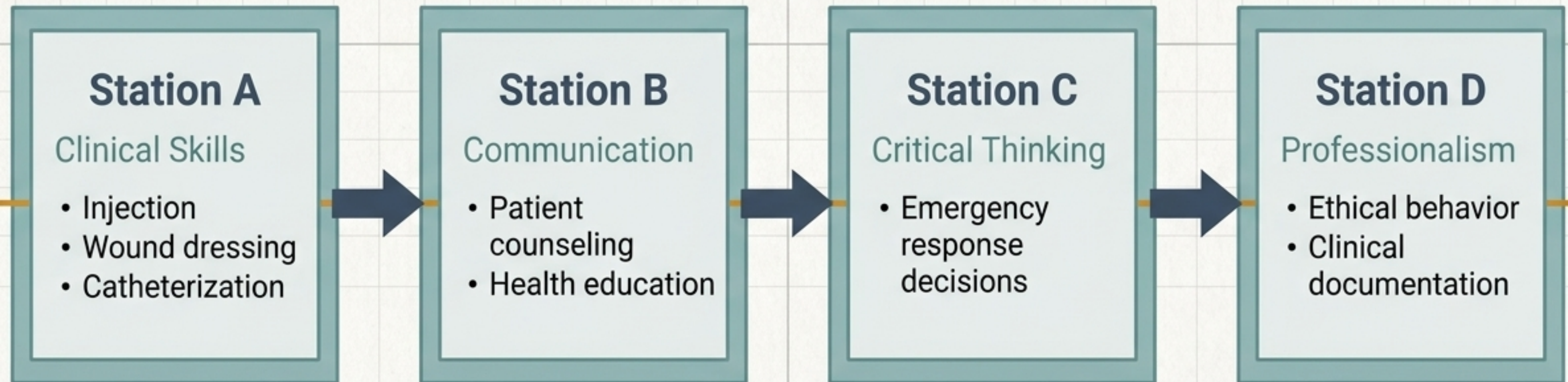

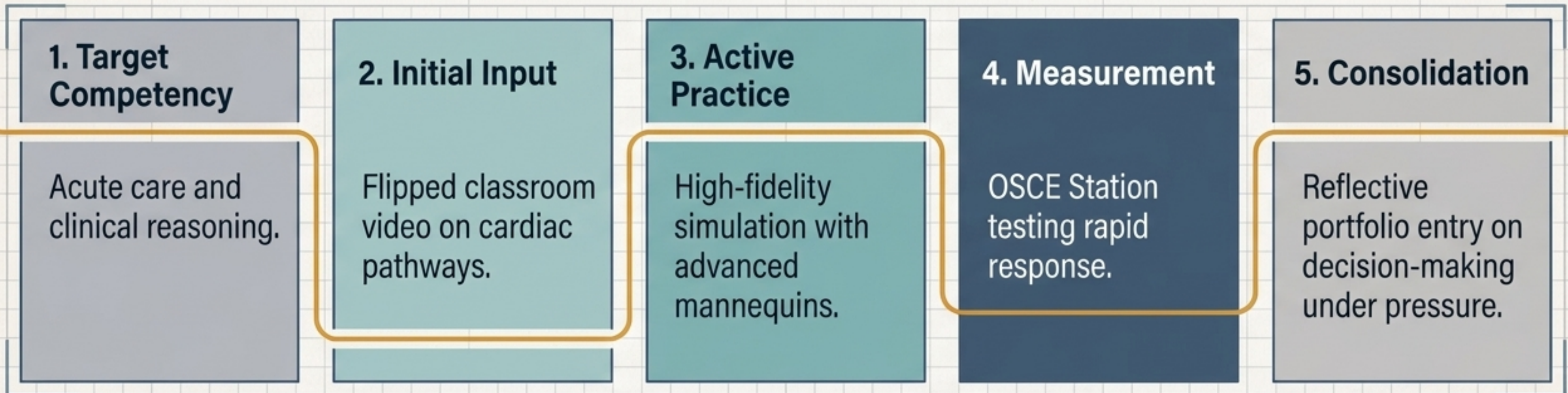
